
Alexander Ramsey House

I am going to Alexander Ramsey House today!




Overview

The Ramsey family had a cook who worked with other staff in the house to make and serve dinner to the family.

I will see Alexander Ramsey's office where he did his political work. His work impacted people, sometimes in good ways and sometimes in bad ways.

I will visit the parlor on the 1st floor. Like a living room today, this is where the family spent time together. I might do an activity with a rope to learn about different sized houses.
