Welcome

I am going to Charles Lindbergh House and Museum today!

Overview

I will learn with my classmates, tour the house, explore exhibits, and spend time outside. There are lots of places to explore. I will stick to the plan and follow my chaperones.







Arrival

I will get off the bus with my group. We will wait outside the museum for our field trip to start. I may have to wait to go inside and use the bathroom.



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Storing our backpacks

I will leave my backpack on the bus. It will stay there until my field trip is over. I will tell an adult if I need something from my backpack.





Restrooms

There are bathrooms in the visitor center. There are not bathrooms in the house. If I am in the house or outside, I can return to the visitor center with an adult to use the bathroom.







Weather

I will be spending time outside. I will need good shoes to explore outside. It may be sunny, cloudy, or rainy. Our group will still spend time outside!



Museum manners

I will follow the rules at Charles Lindbergh House. I will stay with my group, raise my hand to talk, and I will only touch items when the tour guide says it's okay.







Museum staff

The museum staff will be there to help me on my field trip. They can answer my questions. Museum staff wear a Charles Lindbergh t-shirt and name tag.



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Moving around the site

I will go with my group from the museum to the house. The path is smooth and paved. I will use the stairs or the lift to get inside the house.

During the scavenger hunt, I will go on a dirt path. It might be dusty or muddy. There might be sticks and rocks in the path.







Taking a break

If I need to take a break, that is okay! I can tell an adult. There is a quiet space at the museum and the house for my break. I can relax until I am ready to rejoin my group.



Changes

The museum changes sometimes! It is fun to experience new things. If something is closed, it may be open next time!





Museum

I can use the stairs or elevator to enter the exhibit. I will sit on the carpet with letters on it. After I listen to the tour guide, I can play with toys, watch a video, or talk to friends. The video might be loud; I do not have to watch it.







Moving through the museum

I will take the elevator or stairs down to more exhibits. I will see a car as I move through the exhibit. I will go outside with my group on to the patio. We will talk about Charles Lindbergh's love of nature.



Nature scavenger hunt

I will share a clipboard and pencil with others. I will see a river and tall trees. I might feel cool wind or the warm sun. We will look for the plants and animals listed on the scavenger hunt.







Craft activity

I will use markers to color a bag outside on the patio. I will be careful to not get marker on my clothes. When I am done coloring, I will give the bag to my chaperone, and I will get it back when my trip is over.



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Charles Lindbergh House

The house is old, and some rooms are small. It might get crowded if there are a lot of other visitors. I will tell my chaperone if I need a break. We will not enter every room, but we can look as we move past.







The Kitchen

I will go into the kitchen. I might hold an ice block. It will be cold and wet.





Porch

I will go onto the porch. There is a bed on the porch, but our group will sit on the ground. The porch is made of hardwood. It may be cold or sunny depending on the weather.



Living Room

I will sit on the carpet in the living room. There is a piano, and we will hear music. Some people might play the piano. I can let an adult know if it is too loud.







Car

I will take the path to the garage. There will be an old car; I can look at it with my eyes. To protect this car, I will not touch it. This is an important job!



Laundry

I will go outside to do a laundry activity. I can choose to help and an adult will give me a job. It might be wet. I might feel wet fabric. If my hands get wet, they will dry off.







Lunch

If my group is having lunch, we will eat at the park. A tour guide will help us cross the street. I will go with my group to the park. I will see tall trees and green grass. I might see flowers or animals!



Goodbye!

If my group is not eating lunch at the park, we will get on the bus and leave.
