


# SNAKE RIVER

I might see or hear mosquitoes! I can wear bug spray if I want.





# Museum manners

I will follow the rules at Snake River Fur Post. I will be a good listener.

I will stay with my group and won't run. I will stay on the path when I go from the visitor center to the fur post.





# Museum staff

The museum staff will be there to help me on my field trip.

They can answer my questions. Museum staff wear Snake River Fur Post shirts.





# Moving through the site

I will go through the woods to get from the visitor center to the trading post. The ground is uneven, and there are tree roots and rocks. I will see lots of trees and plants. I might see animals and bugs.

If I need to take a break, that is okay! I can tell an adult. I can find a quiet space at the museum for my break. I can relax with an adult until I am ready rejoin my group.






Changes

# **Fur Trade Post**

There is a tall, wooden fence with spikes at the top surrounding the trading post. The trading post is a long wooden building with separate rooms. I will be able to touch items in all of the rooms! The rooms are small and old. I might smell and see new things!







# Trade Post rooms

I will see rooms where people slept, cooked, and worked. The floor is wooden and might be uneven. There are lots of items in these rooms that I can touch like furs and kitchen utensils.



# Making a fire

Our tour guide will show us how to make a small fire with a rock and steel.

It might be loud while they make the fire. The fire is very hot, but it will not touch me. I will watch the tour guide make the fire, and then they will put it out.









I will make a small pouch! I will use a needle to sew. The needle is shiny and sharp. I will be careful so I don't poke myself. I will use soft cloth to make the pouch. I can ask an adult to help me sew the pouch if I want!



# **Gift shop**

I might visit the gift shop. My teacher will let me know if we are going to spend time shopping. I might be able to buy items if I have money with me.








## Lunch I might eat lunch at Snake River Fur Post. We might eat inside or outside depending on the weather. My teacher will choose.
